**Run batted in (RBI)** is given to a batter for each run scored as the result of a batter's plate appearance

A **strikeout** or strike out (denoted by **K**) occurs when the batter receives three strikes during his time at bat

**On base percentage (OBP)** (sometimes referred to as **on base average [OBA]**, as the statistic is rarely presented as a true percentage) is a measure of how often a batter reaches base for any reason other than a fielding error

**Slugging average (abbreviated SLG)** is the most popular measure of the power of a hitter. It is calculated as total bases divided by at bats.

$$SLG = (1B + (2 \times 2B) + (3 \times 3B) + (4 \times HR)) / AB$$

\* **Note that even though these are called "percentages", the number that you will look up is actually written as a decimal.**

**Earned run average (ERA)** is the mean of earned runs given up by a pitcher per nine innings pitched.

**Base on balls (BB)**, better known as a walk, is credited to a batter and against a pitcher when a batter receives four pitches that the umpire calls balls.

**BAVG** is the opponents batting average
